- ( ) 33. Playing while on duty is OK if there are no students at your crossing.
- ( ) 34. Patrol members should be thoroughly trained in their duties before being permitted to take assigned posts.
- ( ) 35. A AAA School Safety Patrol member who is unable to perform his/her duty must contact the Lieutenant or Captain the next day to explain.
- ( ) 36. After releasing students to cross during a safe gap, the patrol member should continue to watch for approaching traffic while holding back stragglers.
- ( ) 37. When it is raining hard, a patrol member should instruct all children to hurry across the street.

## AAA SCHOOL SAFETY PATROL TEST

- ( ) 5. The Captain's Record Book is for keeping daily records of cars parked too close to crosswalks.
- ( ) 6. Patrols have helped reduce the number of traffic accidents that involve elementary school children.
- ( ) 7. A AAA School Safety Patrol member is supposed to instruct and control students in crossing streets at or near schools.
- ( ) 8. The correct position for patrol members to stand while on duty is one step back from the curb line, in between crosswalk lines.
